### A Word from Fr. Jim: Sunday, January 5, 2025

When we were kids we all remember the joy we had playing hideand-seek. There was a certain thrill in thinking that we could become momentarily invisible to the seeker. Then came the peals of delight and surprise when the hiding place is discovered and once again one's whereabouts are clearly known. Today's feast centers on the hiddenness of God's plan having been revealed to all, without discrimination. For Jew and Gentile alike, God's love bursts forth like a light that pierces the darkness. There is no hiding from this wondrous gift as it reaches to the ends of the earth.

Matthew wrote his gospel for a Jewish-Christian audience, followers of Jesus who understood themselves as God's chosen people. Their first make-or-break-it moment came when "pagans" (gentiles) were being baptized without also becoming Jews. Matthew's story of the Magi challenged the Orthodox party that tried to close ranks and keep the community "pure." While we think of the Magi as three, based only on the gifts they bore, they probably travelled as a caravan ---- they needed a sizable group to protect their valuable cargo. They were also seekers, pilgrims in every sense of the word.

Those who are different from us are often a source of fear for us, but in today's gospel they are friends, co-heirs to the promise, and the first to recognize the hidden plans of God. In the gospel narrative, these extraordinary visitors appear only briefly. Would we welcome such strangers who reveal the hidden Holy One in our midst if they were to stay?
